GREETINGS

Dear brothers and sisters:

Another year with its record has passed by. This year again has brought its joys and its sorrows to our homes. Several families have been bereaved by the loss of dear ones, and other members of the church have been, and are suffering from a long siege of sickness. We desire to express the heart-felt sympathy of the whole church with those whose paths have been through the valley of the shadow of death, and also those who have to endure suffering and weakness.

We are not able to understand, and therefore we cannot interpret all things that come to the children of men. We believe, however, that if we could see the whole of life, we would see that all things work together for good. Isaiah saw the children of God on their way home; he saw also many difficulties in their way; but he saw more, he saw that God was present in the difficulties: "When thou passest through the waters I will be with thee; and through the rivers they shall not overflow thee; when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee." Is. 43.2. Thus it ever is with God's people. They have always to pass through hardships and difficulties, but they never pass through them alone. The greater their needs, the nearer God is unto them. We can with full assurance say to all that are in trouble: God is nearer to you than He is to anybody else; He is always nearer to the weak and suffering than He is to the strong and healthy.

The church this year puts special emphasis upon the descent of the Spirit, it is the nineteenth hundred anniversary of the Pentecost. The observation of these anniversaries is not without its dangers. There is the danger for us to reduce the working of the Spirit to dates. History repeatedly teaches us that mighty influences have come to the world and to the church at unexpected seasons and through unexpected channels. The Pentecost came when no one expected it, and in this it is illustrative of the general working of the Spirit.

But it is well for us at these seasons to remind ourselves of the things that are possible unto us.

The Pentecost made each of those who shared in it a better person; from that time forward they were individually better men and women.

Further, the Pentecost made those who shared in it POWERS, POWERS to make others better men and women. The gifts of Pentecost cannot be limited. Once the power takes possession within, it inevitably becomes in some form a tongue that proclaims itself to the world.

Our prayer is that the Divine light will shine upon us again throughout this year, and that we may have the faith and the strength to walk in that light.
