Fathers and Brethren:

The bounty of the year of our Lord 1966 has been evidenced in our increased stewardship of Benevolence. The year has closed with all bills paid and Church Buildings in completely usable condition. Therefore it is appropriate that the bounty of our Lord has showered upon us in crops should be reflected in our giving, not to ourselves for our own enjoyment, but to others through the Benevolence side of our envelopes. And so it has. Of this we ought to be gratefully proud. Also, the payments on our past Benevolence debts (the 50 Million Fund), show nearly one third of our three year goal reached! Since our "call" has always been to evangelize and to teach those evangelized, no changes are involved in adopting these documents. Our work is simply better expressed for the world around us to comprehend. What, then, of us here?

This question has been a matter of prayer of your pastor for the past three years. What are we here for? What work has our Lord for our particular kind of stable, settled, rural, unmixed people to do? Worship? Of course, Sunday morning, and in our homes. Teaching?

Yes, Sunday morning, and through the courses of study in Youth and Women's work. Prayer? No, we are unwilling to meet and pray for each other and our community and world. Evangelism? Some, through our Benevolence giving. But we, personally are not willing to be evangelists with our neighbors. Reluctance on our part to meet to pray, and to evangelize our neighbors is not new. The question is how? This is a question with which your pastor has been concerned in prayer, and as yet has no answer. Therefore the answer must be in some heart in the congregations. Let it be known, that we may move

Still, these are old and fixed problems of concern, what of our rapidly changing world, and our rapidly increasing pressures moral, social, religious and economic? We haven't much of the world's problems of race, politics, poverty, educational illiteracy in our community. All the standard and major problems pass us by, affecting us, yes, but indirectly. What more ought we to be doing? Perhaps opening our homes to Van Wert County's foster children is the answer. We have the stability, morality, and loving care of our families that they need.

May prayer-directed action mark the year of our Lord

together into the Lord's will.
