As we face the challenge of another year there is one basic concern in the life and ministry of Jesus which needs to be our concern in the year ahead. This is the growing concern for the life and ministry of Christian discipleship.

A disciple is basically "one who learns." And there is much learning to be done in our church in the year ahead. Every person who comes into the church and every person who has their name on the rolls of the church needs to listen to the words of Jesus concerning the message and responsibility of Christian discipleship.

One of the greatest weaknesses of the church has been its lack of response to the call to discipleship. When Jesus called his own disciples it was with two simple words, "Follow Me!" That invitation has not changed down through the years. If any change has taken place, the call has grown louder.

If we are to be the living church for the year 1972, we must respond to God's call to Christian discipleship! That call to discipleship will demand three basic Christian responses in our life: .

- 1. The call to discipleship means that we will truly begin to love one another as persons.
- 2. The call to discipleship means that we will truly begin to live with one another as Christians.
- 3. The call to discipleship means that we will begin to learn the meaning of reconciliation.

The basic concern of the church from its very beginning has been the concerns of reconciliation. This is the basis of the human community we call the church. As Christians we need to learn how to love one another; how to live with one another as Christians and how to reconcile any differences we have with one another. This is the basic teaching of Jesus and it is the motivating factor of the church today. It needs to become the motivating factor in our personal life in the year ahead. The doctrine of reconciliation is the primary doctrine in the life and teachings of Jesus. It was the basic love for reconciliation that caused Jesus to make that redemptive journey to the Cross. As disciples we need to be concerned about the principle of reconciliation. We need to strive for a more profound experiential knowledge of reconciliation in the year ahead.
